**Golley Interview
December 21, 2007**

1 Golly: [beginning of recording, a lot of over talk] Well, I don't do hope you find that culprit.

2

3 Detective 1: We do too. We do too.

4

5 Detective Karen: We , on Monday got asked to help out with detectives by doing some
6 interviews on people who haven't been spoken to yet or follow-up interviews. So we're kind of
7 playing catch up with everything, but we saw your name on the list that you worked at Neways.
8 So we thought we'd just come out and see if you could kind of give us some history on the
9 company or how you might know Ken?

10

11 Detective 1: Your affiliation, anything like that.

12

13 Golly: Well, I first met Ken through Neways. at the time he was a distributed, this goes back 13
14 years. and over the course of a number of years, Tom and Dee had their, their issues. And just
15 tell me if you want me to delve into it in greater detail than I have. So feel free to interrupt, but
16 Tom and Dee as they had their issues, Bob and I, I became really good friends with Bob early on,
17 Bob, Robert Steed, , Bob is what I call him. Rob, Ken's brother, also became a good friend of
18 ours. We shared a common interest and often went hunting as we did this morning. And so and
19 so on. And, Ken would also periodically join in and the four of us and others would just enjoy
20 friendships and outdoor activities. And so on. Well, throughout the years, those relationships
21 stayed. And, of course through the relationship between Ken and Dee blossomed, especially as
22 the relationship between she and Tom worsen, and have just enjoyed, I wouldn't say really
23 close friendship with Ken, but, certainly a friendship with, with the family for as long as I can
24 remember. You know what, what's so sad about all this in mind, him, and I know I'm all over
25 the place, not a word to say this before I forget. And that is what I was. I was actually flying
26 back from the Cayman islands when I received a phone call that, Ken had been shot. And the
27 first thing that came to my mind was I would bet it's someone who knows someone who's with
28 Dee and let me illustrate that. I had a hard time envisioning that it was anything other than
29 someone who's incarcerated with Dee learned of her money, learned of her wealth, told one of
30 her drug addict, low life boyfriends, or someone like that. Hey, if you go put the hurt on her old
31 man, I'll bet he he'd be good for some cabbage, something just horribly ill like that. And it
32 probably turned really sour. That was the first thing that came to my mind. whether or not
33 there's truth to it, God we'll never know, but that was, something that really struck me. And I'm
34 assuming you probably pursued that angle already, but I have to think there's someone in
35 someone with Dee now who was incarcerated with her probably knows who shot Ken is my
36 feeling.

37

38 Detective Karen: So Dee is not shy about telling people about her wealth and

39

40 Golly: She was at first I'm sure and then she probably still is really shy about it. But one thing
41 about Dee is once you build a relationship with her, she can be very, very outgoing and it's in
42 Dee's person. You just know, and you will know, especially if you spend any time with her, it
43 doesn't strike me as being a lot at all if you know how much money she's got,

44

45 Detective 3: How long ago was Neways sold? Didn't they

46

47 Golly: A year ago, November.

48

49 Detective 3: So the year,

50

51 Golly: but she had a lot of money prior to. She was incarcerated actually about the same time
52 as the sale was finalized.

53

54 Detective Karen: What exactly does Neways do?

55

56 Golly: Manufacture and distribute personal care products and nutritional products.

57

58 Detective 1: Kind of like a NuSkin type,

59

60 Golly: similar to. Tom and Dee were the, founders of it ,co-owners. So there were the two
61 principles. So those two exclusively shared in the wealth of the company, they were rewarded
62 handsomely. So it's just hard to imagine that the kind of people who were surrounding Dee
63 currently didn't think that it would be an easy way to get some benefit by causing Ken's or grief.

64

65 Detective Karen: Did you ever hear Ken anytime you'd be around him talking about any
66 problems between him and D or associates of Dee's or so, as far as you knew everything was
67 good between Dee and Ken?

68

69 Golly: Oh, Yeah. I mean, they had their, their usual spats, like any other relationship would, but
70 nothing out of the ordinary.

71

72 Detective 1: What company do you work for now?

73

74 Golly: I still work for Neways

75

76 Detective 1: in Neways, you're still an employee. They're still family affiliation with Neways or

77

78 Golly: No,

79

80 Detective 1: not at all. Okay.

81

82 Detective Karen: How how's the family doing since you were just in Bob this morning?

83

84 Golly: They're struggling over this. As you can imagine, it was a real emotional low. Have you
85 not spoken with the family?

86

87 Detective 1: Having a lot of interviews have been done and were conducted right away. And
88 then there's been a lot of peripheral people like yourself that as the investigation has, you

89 know, blossomed out, we're going every direction with it. And detectives that the main case
90 manager handed us a list. They actually brought us from our other jobs and said, we need some
91 help with this. We need some extra bodies to go out and do some of these peripheral
92 interviews. And so they really had us just going out and saying, just go talk to these people and
93 see what, what their feeling is, what they know, what their connection is. And, and, you know,
94 we're just trying to explore every, every avenue and talk to anybody who has personal
95 information,

96

97 Detective Karen: playing catch up.

98

99 Detective 1: When was the last time you talked to Ken prior to him being killed? You said you
100 were in Cayman. Had you been gone for several weeks or

101

102 Golly: Just a couple of days Oh, I hadn't talked with Ken for gosh, he and I didn't speak
103 frequently.

104

105 Detective 1: So it had been.

106

107 Golly: so it was only periodically, probably a couple of months.

108

109 Detective 1: So you weren't aware of any business adventures or anything, anything new that
110 he was encountering or starting or any new dealings ?

111

112 Golly: Only the Preserve and different real estate ventures and things of that nature. But I don't
113 know the people he's dealing with particularly.

114

115 Detective 1: So it'd been a couple months prior to, so you didn't have any, it's not like you
116 knew what ..

117

118 Golly: ...really intimate knowledge of what he was doing that day or the days previous. No.

119

120 Detective 1; Okay.

121

122 Detective 1: Anything else that you can think of that may be, important?

123

124 Golly: Well, I know there's been a lot of supposition on the part of, Dee's family that Tom had
125 something to do with this, or Tom's family had something to do with it. And I should probably
126 go on record as saying, I wouldn't put it past either any three of them. I really would not put it
127 past them.

128

129 Detective 1: If you know, and I guess, again, I'm not that familiar and we're just now starting to
130 kind of learn the affiliation and the marriages and the, where the kids belong. It's, it's really
131 been kind of hard for us to step in because we haven't been working on this the whole time.

132 But you say that there's a lot of people assuming that somebody from Tom's family was

133 involved, what's there to gain if the sale was final and the money was distributed evenly. What
134 would there be to gain? On Thomas.

135

136 Golly: Tom is an incredibly egotistical and what's the word I'm looking for? he's very,

137

138 Detective 1: Tom Senior?

139

140 Golly: yes, he's a very spiteful man, very controlling. I had to deal with this. So I'm speaking
141 from personal experience, and can be very hateful. And, vengeful is probably the word there.
142 Narcissistic is a word you hear very often about, him and, he used to boast a lot about his
143 capabilities in Russia and how he could, how he could get somebody knocked off for a thousand
144 bucks and the power he wheeled and his God-like status amongst distributors. And so on

145

146 Detective 1: How was he connected with Russia? just through Neways?

147

148 Golly: Just through Neways and through his new business ventures. I'm sure he kept a lot of
149 contacts there, but it wouldn't surprise me in the least that, that he would do this just to hurt
150 Dee, I mean, I really wouldn't put it past him based on his personality and what I know of him
151 just to hurt Dee and to send a message.

152

153 Detective 1: Was he pretty angry with Dee then still?

154

155 Golly: Yeah.

156

157 Detective 1: So it wasn't like he was holding a torch or anything that they wanted to rekindle,
158 anything

159

160 Golly: That that's, I think exactly why, I mean, the opposite of love, isn't hate it's indifference
161 and he was not indifferent.

162

163 Detective 1: I see what you mean. When you say that he could knock somebody out for a
164 thousand bucks. Was it his Russian affiliation? Are you talking Russian mafia?

165

166 Golly: Yes

167

168 Detective 1: You didn't say it, that's kind of where I thought you were going with it, but you
169 didn't say it. So I wanted to just clarify.

170

171 Golly: He would boast of those years and years ago, so, and I know that's, that's horribly
172 speculative on my part, but I, all I'm trying to say here is I don't think that anyone should
173 discount entirely the capabilities that Tom and his two oldest or his two boys, Tom, Jr. And
174 Derek might have.

175

176 Detective 1: And this has come up before this whole Russian mafia thing?

177

178 Golly: Oh, I, I know 't has

179

180 Detective 1: you know, Again,

181

182 Golly: I guarantee you, the detectives have gone down this path. I've talked with Bob about it
183 quite a bit. So I know it's in front of the other detectives, but the one bit, I don't know, that is in
184 front of them. Is that, that postulation I made of, I think someone who's incarcerated with Dee
185 knows who did it, They really do.

186

187 Detective 1: Do you think Dee knew about ?

188

189 Golly: It I don't think no. No. I don't think Dee knew about it at all, but considering the type of
190 person she's surrounded by, it, it doesn't seem odd at all. Does It? That someone might learn of
191 her wealth and tell someone here on the outside, Hey, I'm here. I'm serving time with this gal.
192 Who's worth 300 and some odd million dollars.

193

194 Detective 1: Well, like you, we've kind of in our minds, gone every direction with this, you
195 know, there's like I said, that the affiliation with Russia and affiliation with federal prison and,
196 you know, the people that there's an awful lot of money.

197

198 Detective Karen: Would Dee have any, anything extra to gain by being a part of it ?

199

200 Golly: Oh Heavens no, no, Not at all.

201

202 Golly: She has a lot to lose though. She's the kind of person who hates to be alone. And so
203 looking forward to coming out and spending her time with, with Kenny . nonstop, Before she's
204 incarcerated, this is, this is a woman who never was ever seen alone. She always had an
205 entourage with her, whether it be a personal assistants or it was Ken, or, you know, it was
206 usually Ken later on, but she hates to be alone. The thought that somehow she might benefit
207 from this is contrary to everything I know about Dee.

208

209 Detective 1: Interesting.

210

211 Detective Karen: I had another question that's totally out of my mind now, [background talk]

212

213 Detective 1: Did, Do they have money prior to, Tom and Dee here to and creating Neways Is
214 that where their money came from Or did they have money to begin with Tom ended He, yeah,

215

216 Golly: No. They created it through Neways, well, sorry. Let me back up. Dee's parents had some
217 measure of wealth. When they married, let's see. And this was Tom's 3rd marriage, Dee's I think
218 second. but anyway, it wasn't a fortune. It was just some measure of wealth that they were
219 able to use to start Neways. But their fortunes were made all exclusively through Neways and
220 Neways related activities.

221

222 Detective 1: Did you think of what it was?

223

224 Detective Karen: No. Oh, I don't know if I've ever heard are Dee and Tom in the same prison
225 together.

226

227 Detective 1: No they're not. Yeah. I actually asked that this morning. I didn't know
228 [unintelligible]

229

230 Detective Karen: I said they wouldn't have contact really together.

231

232 Detective 1: Nope

233

234 Detective Karen: Okay

235

236 Golly: Money is a horrible motivator.

237

238 Detective 1: Isn't it though. It makes it difficult to investigate. You know.

239

240 Golly: Glad , there are so many people,... one thing too about Dee is she was always encircled
241 about by these vultures. She was always doling out money to people because she hated to see
242 anybody in need, even if it was just a contrived need, people would come out of the
243 woodworks. I'm about to lose this and so-and-so needs this. And she was, she would fork out
244 money like crazy. and, and she was just so giving that way.

245

246 Detective 1: How long has, when did, when was Neways, started? When did they start that up
247 Do you know the year?

248

249 Golly: 91, 91-92.

250

251

252 Detective Karen: And you said it was sold a year ago,

253

254 Detective 1: Dee and Tom were married for quite some time. Correct? They were, Is that the 29
255 years they were married.

256

257 Golly: Almost 30 years.

258

259 Detective 1: So that's a long relationship.

260

261 Golly: They had two children together.

262

263 Detective 1: And that was Derek and J J.

264

265 Golly: Derek and JJ.

266

267 Detective 1: Like I said, we're just playing catch up and there's names and stepsons and half-
268 brothers and, oh boy.

269

270 Detective Karen: And yet you, you mentioned before that Tom Jr. and Derek are very similar to
271 Tom Sr.

272

273 Golly: They are.

274

275 Karen Detective: Okay.

276

277 Golly: Yeah. Very, very similar.

278

279 Detective 1: They're just half brothers, correct?

280

281 Golly: Correct, but they are best friends.

282

283 Detective 1: I haven't met, I haven't met them. I haven't met Bob yet either. Did Bob have
284 anything to say, did he know that we called I think we might be talking to Bob later, but I think
285 he's already been, I think he's dealt with the detectives quite a bit.

286

287 Golly: Oh yes, [laugh] Yes.

288

289 Detective 1: And he, his businesses he's usually at Travani. Is that correct ?

290

291 Detective Karen: Is Travani a similar company to Neways or is it totally separate or different ?

292

293 Golly: Well, there are some similarities. Yeah. It's in the same industry.

294

295 Detective Karen: Yeah.

296

297 Detective 1: Okay. Can you think of anything else that comes to mind or information or
298 somebody else that you think we should talk to or anything at all that,

299

300 Golly: Only that I hope, every person who's ever been in carp who has ever spent any time
301 around Dee is being looked at and every correspondence they've had with people on the
302 outside to speak very closely looked.

303

304 Detective 1: Yeah. We're looking at about every, and that's why this has just been so time
305 consuming is, cause there's just so much to it. Like I said, that's why we're just out kind of doing
306 some of these peripheral interviews, just trying to get thoughts and feelings. And,

307

308 Golly: But there that many people in there with Dee?

309 Detective 1: I don't know. I don't know. And I know the detectives have, have, looked into all
310 sorts of different things. And I know that that they're obviously, everybody's doing the
311 hypothetical. What if and was it her Was it him Was it somebody she's in with, you know, it,
312 was it Russian Is it Yeah, I think everybody's pretty much gone every direction possible. So I
313 think I can say without a doubt that those things are being looked into being a federal prison,
314 unsure that, they document and keep track of contacts and calls and everything else. I don't see
315 how it, I mean, they do that at the jail. I can't imagine that federal prison, not monitoring things
316 as closely or closer.

317

318 Golly: I wish I had more information to give you,

319

320 Detective 1: oh, this

321

322 Karen Detective: . You gave us quite a bit.

323

324 Detective 1: And in the end you just never know what's going to be helpful or not. So we
325 appreciate you taking the time.

326

327 Karen Detective: It gives us a better feel to, since we're playing catch up with, there's not a
328 month worth of information to catch up on.

329

330 Detective: So I started reading about the case, you know, last week and my head was spinning
331 after about two hours going, Tom, who junior, senior, you know, and now we're starting to kind
332 of understand the affiliations. And I think half the battle was knowing who's whose son and
333 who's who, you know, how are they related And that was half the battle was just trying to get
334 the relationships down and then they give us a name and say, go talk to Jason and I'd go, oh,
335 who's he, I hadn't heard that name yet.

336

337 Golly: Just a friend of the family.

338

339 Detective 1: Yeah. So we appreciate you meeting with us. I can give you a card, if anything else
340 comes to mind. the desk phone that I'm adopting for a little while is on the back. If you have
341 anything at all, any other questions, or if you think of anything, feel free to give us a call. We
342 appreciate your time.

343

344 Golly: It's my pleasure. And I will [fades out]
